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## Clubs and Communities Descriptions

**Change Makers (Student Voice Committee):** The Change Makers or Student Voice Committee is a group of students working with school leadership to get student opinions and ideas to become a reality and enhance the school experience for all students. We have a meeting most weeks at A-Block Mondays and Tuesdays you can email Mrs Sgalippa or listen at assemblies or just check student notices for more information.

**Chess, homework, drawing:** Monday Afternoon Program, Parents Sign you up and you Pick, Chess, Homework, Drawing, Sustainability, Gardening, Reading, Etc until 3:00pm.

**Duke of Ed:** The Duke of Edinburgh Award is a program that helps students build confidence, independence, and real-life skills while doing things they already enjoy. Activities like sport, music, volunteering, and leadership can all count toward a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award—so instead of being extra work, Duke recognises the effort students are already putting in. Through Duke, students learn how to set goals, manage their time, work as a team, and push themselves outside their comfort zones. The camps and adventures are often the highlight, creating unforgettable memories and friendships while building resilience. The Award is internationally recognised, which means it looks great on resumes, university applications, and scholarship forms. It shows future employers and universities that students are motivated, committed, and willing to challenge themselves. Most importantly, Duke helps students realise what they're capable of—and believe in themselves.

**Gaming:** This is a room next to the library where you can go to play games on your laptop to stay out of the sun and not disturb people studying in the library. It is a free space for anyone to go and game with friends, just make sure to be respectful to your peers and the teacher on duty.

**Iris Auxilium:** Iris Auxilium (Rainbow Room) is a safe, supportive space open to all students from Years 7 to 12. It's a welcoming environment for those who identify as LGBTQIA+ or are exploring their identity, offering friendship, understanding, and a chance to connect with others. This is not a club, more of a community and as such is a confidential space where everyone is respected and supported.

**Leo's Club:** LEO – Leadership, Experience, Opportunity. I01 Every Wednesday Morning 8:00-8:30. Leo's club is a place where anyone can join and be a part of something that gives back to the community. We host a BBQ at the Currumbin Waters IGA every Saturday to raise money for Various Charities and we often host events and fun activities for the community e.g. Trivia Nights, Fundraisers, bare foot bowling, Etc. 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**Sustainability committee:** The Sustainability Committee is a student group that meets weekly (Friday, Lunch 1 in V02) to discuss ideas to make PBC a greener, more sustainable school. We welcome all student who are passionate about the environment and want to make a more positive impact on the world around them. If you have any Ideas or suggestions on how you would like to see the school become more sustainable, please give us a visit.
