

Key Terms

- QCE = Queensland Certificate of Education
- Unit 1 & Unit 2 = Year 11 (Terms 1-3, 2023)
- Unit 3 & Unit 4 = Year 12 (Term 4, 2023 Term 4, 2024)
- General subject = Academically rigorous compliment tertiary study
- Applied subject = more practical
- VET = Vocational subject / Certificate course



QCE – Important Points

- <u>Every student</u> at PBC is working towards attaining a QCE (regardless of subjects)
- 20 credits = QCE
- Unit 1 & 2 accumulate one separate credit
 - if the student obtains at least a satisfactory grade
- Unit 3 & 4 accumulate two credits (i.e. as a pair)
- Very limited subject changes in Year 11
- No subject changes in Year 12

20 credits from contributing courses of study, including:

- QCAA-developed subjects or courses
- vocational education and training (VET) qualifications
- non-Queensland studies

- Preparatory (maximum 4)
- · Complementary (maximum 8).



Satisfactory completion, grade of C or better, competency or qualification completion, pass or equivalent.



Students must meet literacy and numeracy requirements through one of the available learning options.

Types of Subjects

General	Applied	Vocational Education and Training (VET)
 Rigorous academic subject Suited to students who are interested in tertiary studies after school Contribute to an ATAR 	 Less rigorous academic subject Generally embed a practical component Suited to students who are interested in vocational training or work after school 	 Less rigorous academic subject Generally embed a practical component Higher level certificates (i.e. CIV and Diploma) are academically rigorous May use VETSs funding or a Fee for Service CIII or higher may lead to tertiary pathways



Pathways at PBC

ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank)

- A combined score of results from rigorous, academic subjects (i.e. General Subjects).
- Universities recognise an ATAR as an entry score.

Personalised

- A combination of General, Applied and VET (Vocational Education) subjects.
- Most universities recognise VET qualifications as an entry score (i.e. Certificate III or higher).



ATAR Pathway

- ATAR: number between 0.00 and 99.95 with increments of 0.05
- Students must satisfactorily complete an English subject (Sound Achievement) to be ATAR-eligible
- English will only count if it is one of a student's best five subject results
- ALL ATAR students at PBC are required to study 5 General subjects



Assessment in General Subjects

- Combination of school-based assessment and common external assessment
- Unit 1 and 2 Formative; Unit 3 and 4 Summative
- Unit 3 and 4; four assessments (3 school-based + 1 external)
- School-based assessment will contribute 75%; 50% in maths and science
- School-based assessment will not be scaled against the results of the external assessment
- Students will receive a numerical and A–E final subject result; A–E only for applied subjects



Personalised Pathway

- Students must select no more than 3 ATAR subjects
- General subjects are strongly discouraged if a student has been placed in Essential English.
- Students should select at least 1 CIII course (or higher) via a
 VET subject or school-based traineeship as there are a range
 of tertiary pathways for students that have completed a
 Certificate III or higher level certificate.
- Students studying a Certificate IV or Diploma need to be studying General English
- Recent changes to the Diploma of Business include increase in price and 18 months to complete the course



VET In School (VETIS)



What is VETiS funding?

- VETiS = vocational education and training in schools
- Funded by the QLD Government
- Every student over 15 has access to 1 free VETiS funded course whilst at school
- Students can only undertake 1 VETiS course and only 1 SAT (School based apprenticeship or traineeship)
- They can complete a VETiS course, a SAT, and multiple Fee For Service courses (e.g. DOB and VCJ)



School Based Apprenticeships & Traineeships (SATs)

	TRAINEESHIP	APPRENTICESHIP
Duration	1-2 years to complete	3-4 years to complete
Qualificati on	Certificate II – III (usually level III)	Certificate III, IV
Status	School-based, Part- time, Full-time	School-based, Part- time, Full-time
Туре	NON-TRADE areas: e.g. business, retail, administration, hospitality, salon assistant, fitness etc.	Traditional TRADE areas: e.g. automotive, metal fabrication, cookery, hairdressing, electrical, carpentry etc.

Next steps

- Book your 1-1 interview for next week through PBC website
- 2. Research individual subjects the Subject Selection Guide off the PBC Website https://pbc-shs.eq.edu.au/curriculum/senior-secondary/year11
- 3. Fill in your SET Plan form and have it completed for your interview
- Complete 'online subject selections' (refer to OneSchool Subject Selections instructions attached to on the School Website) https://pbc-shs.eq.edu.au/curriculum/senior-secondary/year11
- Each student must select 8 subjects: this includes Maths, English and 6 elective preferences in priority order. Students will get <u>any four</u> of their six elective preferences.



Next steps cont...

- Before choosing subjects students must carefully consider the requirements, pre-requisites of each subject and what will best suit them
- Students should choose subjects that:
 - 1. They enjoy
 - 2. Think they will excel in
 - 3. That satisfy prerequisites for tertiary courses/pathways that they will be seeking entry to



Important Subject Points

- There are presentations/speeches every subject
- English 2 novels and a play
- Health Education and Physical Education
- Every General subject is academically challenging
- Hospitality subjects service periods which require extra hours
- Rec and Aquatic Practices swimming ability
- VET subjects still have homework/competencies
