Past pathways (2020 cohort) – 79% response rate in June 2021


• In 2021, 92.0% of Year 12 completers from PBC were engaged in education, training or employment in the year after they completed school.


Main destination

- 55.6% continued in some recognised form of education and training. The most common study destination was bachelor degree.
- 36.5% transitioned directly into paid employment and no further study.
- 8% seeking work or not engaged in education or work (travel/health)

Key message

- A key message to take away almost all Year 12 students are university eligible should they wish to pursue this path
- Qualifications include:
 - Entry to SCU via Early Offer Program
 - Tertiary entry to a range of Universities through Cert III, Cert IV, Diploma qualification
 - Tertiary entry through ATAR



SCU Early Offer



- SCU Early Offer Program is a popular option for graduates
- Open now, and applicable to all Year 12 school leavers
- Peace of mind with direct entry prior to the end of the year
- No ATAR, no pre-requisite subjects required
- Range of degrees offered
- Ask SCU outside and apply



GU Guaranteed Admissions

- Griffith University is also a popular destination for PBC graduates
- Offers a range of early offer, and guaranteed admissions for 2023
- Qualifications eligible include Cert 3, Cert 4, Diploma and ATAR
- Adjustment factors for local area/subjects studied
- Ask GU outside for further information



- Exam (medicine and dentistry may require UCAT)




Preferences
